New Business (Action/Non-action Items) – 8:50 a.m.	Guest Introductions: Pahoua-Sac Steps Forward Emily Halcon, City Manager Homeless Coordinator  Emily's Halcon intro and update: After the City discovered they had previously spent 14 mil on homeless in the city, her role was recently created by the city manager to 1) provide information/education to business owners, elected officials, outside agencies, law enforcement, etc. 2)work with external partners (sac steps forward, sac county, sac redevelop agency, etc. Her primary focus is to seek a long term strategy to address homelessness.  3 mil has been allocated related to homelessness, funds given to organizations like sac steps fwd, rapid rehousing, etc. Programming has begun with these organizations. Biggest initiative established between the city and county is a request to redistribute 1600 public housing assets. SHRA is hosting a town hall

tonight to engage the community on their recommendations of how to reallocate housing.

Advised she works closely with PD and their, "impact team" comprised of seven people in the city to address constituent complaints about homeless camps. Last year, PD had 34,000 calls for service re: homelessness complaints, which is 11% of all calls made in 2016.

**Paul Freeman, PD**-expanded on description of their impact team. Majority of work is performed in downtown due to restrictions of the grant received for the program.

Security Update: (outside of PBID): Valentines Day shooting at Golden Coral took place at 9pm inside the restaurant. Altercation began with two individuals; multiple shots were fired, resulted in 2 shooting victims that were transported to Kaiser South Sac, no known motive at the time.

**Andrew Duncan, Paladin**- 4pm-8pm is busiest time for dispatch (around time when school is getting out, many of issues are with the juvenile population) Highest calls for service are as follows:

29 trespassing and/or loitering

13 selling vehicles on private property,

13 incidents with disturbed persons,

29 illegal camping issues

McDonalds had the highest calls for service (33 in the last month)

214 calls for service (total)

## Jenna update:

McDonalds high volume of calls may be due to a particular individual that has been previously trespassed in surrounding businesses and residential areas. Identified some problem areas in the PBID that should be addressed.

**Jenna overnight patrol update**: Patrol is working closely with Pahoua and Sac Steps Forward

**Jenna Clean Team Update:** Identified biggest problem area in PBID. Street Team will be working with CalTrans to improve area following rainstorms.
